

Adoration

"The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this Sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go meet Him in Adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our Adoration never cease." Catechism of the Catholic Church Paragraph 1380.

What to do in Adoration?

- 1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Whether you are praising, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness or seeking an answer, you'll find an appropriate psalm. The ancient prayer of the Church, called the Liturgy of the Hours, presents an excellent way to pray through the book of Psalms throughout the year.
- 2. Recite the "Jesus Prayer." Say "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner," repeatedly as you quiet your heart and mind.

Pastor's Page

I can't tell you how many times I've been accused—even as a priest—of being unchristian. Most often, the scenario is that an evident drug addict or alcoholic is "jonesing" for a fix. After refusing to give money (although I normally offer a cup of coffee or some food), comes the accusation: "And you call yourself a man of God!" - or - "That's not what Jesus would do."

Which prompts the question so popularized by those bracelets back in the 1990s: *WWJD - What Would Jesus Do*?

That is a great question, presuming one could accurately KNOW the answer so as to willingly CHOOSE to imitate Jesus. The fact is that Sacred Scripture tells us that God's ways are not our ways, and our ways are not His ways. The fact is that Jesus was incredibly unpredictable.

The easiest answer to WWJD is that Jesus would without exception act in accordance with both Truth and Love—since God is Truth, and God is Love.

But I have another insightful question: Did Jesus actually mean it when He said to His disciples, "If you love Me, keep My commandments." Jesus links truth and love. The two go hand in hand.

By contrast, our secularized culture often sets asunder truth and love. In other words, either I tell sinners the truth, or I love them instead (e.g. Who am I to judge?"

But Jesus demands us as Christians to "teach all that He commands us" so as to make disciples. He also knew that we would struggle. The Church as a teacher MUST teach the truth in a way that is consistent with love. Regarding some essentially delicate moral issues, sometimes the Church is called hateful for teaching the one truth that lovingly leads to heaven.

So, the real question is this: WWYD -- What Will You Do?

Be faithful to ALL that Jesus commanded? - or - sell out to the world?
