

#### Adoration

### What to do in Adoration?

- 1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Whether you are praising, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness or seeking an answer, you'll find an appropriate psalm. The ancient prayer of the Church, called the Liturgy of the Hours, presents an excellent way to pray through the book of Psalms throughout the year.
- 2. Recite the "Jesus Prayer." Say "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner," repeatedly as you quiet your heart and mind.

We are going to be kicking off the new year by diving head first into our prayer life! Throughout the month of January, we will be starting a series called "Pray Like Jesus".



## PASTOR'S PAGE

## Lectio Divina

"Ignorance of Scripture is Ignorance of Christ."

-- Saint Jerome

Lectio Divina (sacred reading) is an ancient way to pray with Sacred Scripture. In fact, it is the manner in which the Fathers of the Church, especially the monastics, approached Sacred Scripture, and it has borne much theological fruit. It is not so much a method of meditation but simply a prayerful reading and reflection upon the Biblical texts. In short, God speaks His Word to us, and we seek to understand it in order to respond in faith, hope, and love.

Begin with a prayer to the Holy Spirit and to Our Lady.

While Lectio Divina is not a method, there are four components which are as follows:

Lectio (reading): What does the text literally say?

Read and re-read the text slowly several times. Begin to note what is being said. Then take note of what captures *your* attention.

Meditatio (meditation): What does Jesus say to me personally?

As you continue to read the text, take note of what captures your attention. You can simply repeat a particular word or phrase--letting it sink in, and letting God speak to you through the text. You may do this several times with several words or phrases BUT the goal is more to go deep into each word or phrase than to cover a lot of them in one sitting. Another approach is to imagine one's self in the Biblical event as an observer or participant or even as one of the characters. Note: you may also return to the previous step as necessary or move on to the next when you are ready.

Oratio (prayer): What is your personal response to God's word for you?

Spontaneous acts of adoration, contrition, thanksgiving, and supplication, etc., in response to God's Word. Simply let these prayers emerge from your heart.

Contemplatio (contemplation): Sitting silently with God's Word.

"Be still and know that I am God." It is in this silent stillness that God's grace fills you and strengthens you. As this is a gift that God gives and cannot be forced, not every Lection Divina reaches this point. Yet, one disposes one's self to receive the gift by one's sitting with a silent and still awareness of God and His love.

Again, it is important to point out that Lectio Divina is not a method. One can move rather fluidly between the steps which may not always follow sequence. Let the Holy Spirit be our guide. Finally, it is also worth noting that one's meditatio can continue throughout the day as often as one allows himself to recall the sacred text and repeat some word or phrase, etc.
