

Adoration

"The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this Sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go meet Him in Adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the serious offenses and crimes of the world. Let our Adoration never cease." Catechism of the Catholic Church Paragraph 1380.

What to Do in Adoration?

- 1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Whether you are praising, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness or seeking an answer, you'll find an appropriate psalm. The ancient prayer of the Church, called the Liturgy of the Hours, presents an excellent way to pray through the book of Psalms throughout the year.
- 2. Recite the "Jesus Prayer." Say "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner," repeatedly as you quiet your heart and mind.



St. Joseph Corner Noble Offspring of David

St. Joseph was a man of duty. When he found out about the pregnancy of his wife Mary, he wanted to do what the law required but in a righteous way. However, the angel told him that he was to take Mary into his home and thus take the child to be born as his own. This was so that Jesus would be in the line of David. It was from the line of David that the Messiah was to come forth for Israel. Thus Joseph, being in the line of David, was the vehicle by which the Davidic promise would be fulfilled. The Davidic dynasty was thought to have been destroyed when the Temple was destroyed by the Babylonians in 587 B.C. But God always keeps His promises, and it is through the man Joseph, that the Messianic promise was finally realized for Israel in a way they never imagined.
