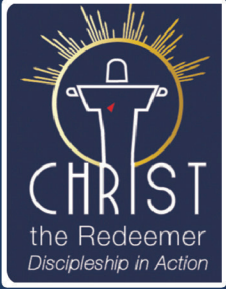

Adoration

What to do in Adoration?

1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Whether you are praising, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness or seeking an answer, you'll find an appropriate psalm. The ancient prayer of the Church, called the Liturgy of the Hours, presents an excellent way to pray through the book of Psalms throughout the year.
2. Recite the "Jesus Prayer." Say "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner," repeatedly as you quiet your heart and mind.

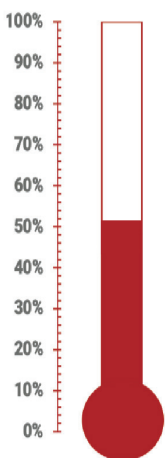

Pastor's Page

RUN SO AS TO WIN THE RACE....

Football games are seldom won by throwing a hundred-yard touchdown. They are usually won by means of a series of first downs, and some drives never make it all the way to the endzone. Still other drives may result in a field goal, which may not always win the game, but still hopefully contributes to a final victory.

Why all this talk about football?

Because it is a metaphor for the **ongoing battle to stop abortion**—always and everywhere. Consider these words of St. John Paul the Great from The Gospel of Life, paragraph 73, as follows:

A particular problem of conscience can arise in cases where a legislative vote would be decisive for the passage of a more restrictive law, aimed at limiting the number of authorized abortions, in place of a more permissive law already passed or ready to be voted on. Such cases are not infrequent. It is a fact that while in some parts of the world there continue to be campaigns to introduce laws favoring abortion, often supported by powerful international organizations, in other nations-particularly those which have already experienced the bitter fruits of such permissive legislation-there are growing signs of a rethinking in this matter. In a case like the one just mentioned, when it is not possible to overturn or completely abrogate a pro-abortion law, an elected official, whose absolute personal opposition to procured abortion was well known, could licitly support proposals aimed at limiting the harm done by such a law and at lessening its negative consequences at the level of general opinion and public morality. This does not in fact represent an illicit cooperation with an unjust law, but rather a legitimate and proper attempt to limit its evil aspects.

Let me be crystal clear. THE CATHOLIC CHURCH CATEGORICALLY CONDEMNS ALL PROCURED ABORTIONS AS INTRINSICALLY EVIL. All her members from the pope down to the pews have a grave moral duty to fight to end abortion and all crimes against humanity. We do this by acting as Christian citizens with informed consciences.

We do not support the *Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act* as good in itself. It is the lesser of two evils. It is at best a first down to the extent that it limits the timeframe to procure a legal abortion in half from 40 to 20 weeks. This shifts the momentum of the fight in our direction, but there is much more of a fight to be hard fought if we will prevail to victory.

Therefore, let your postcard in support of the NJ law not amount to falling on the ball. Let us press on to the endzone. Let us press on to VICTORY!
