Altar Server Commitments

- Serve at all assigned Masses or find a replacement as needed
- Arrive at least 15 min. before all assigned Masses
- Press appropriately for all Masses:
 - Boys Press shoes and trousers, etc.
 - Girls Press shoes and attire; accessories that are simple and not glitzy
- Assist the priests & deacons as needed during liturgies
- Set a good example for the entire congregation
- Find spiritual fulfillment by conscious participation in the liturgy and other personal prayer

Want to Join Us?

Youth Servers

- WHO: Any child from 3rd grade and higher who has received First Holy Communion and has completed the training program
- WHCN: May be assigned to any Saturday evening or Sunday Mass and other parish liturgies; weddings and funerals are assigned on a voluntary basis

Masters of Ceremonies & Sacristans

- WHO: Any high school student who has been Confirmed, is otherwise eligible for ministry, and has completed the training program
- WHEN: May be assigned to serve funerals and to assist as needed at other parish liturgies


