#### **OUR PARISH FAMILY**

Christ the Redeemer Parish, Atco was formed from the merger of Assumption, Atco; St. Lucy, Blue Anchor and Sacred Heart, Cedar Brook—already merged as Bd. John XXIII—and St. Anthony, Waterford Works. Parishioners from each community met for two years to work through a host of issues. They worked hard to preserve their unique history and heritage. After much prayer and perseverance, our new parish of Christ the Redeemer Parish was born on November 10, 2010.

Eight years later, Christ the Redeemer Parish is truly blessed to be a community of Christ's faithful who truly love their parish. We look forward to sustainable growth and to doing what it takes to flourish long into the future.

#### Two things are a must to ensure Christ the Redeemer flourishes:

- (1) As a parish church built of living stones (1 Peter 2:5), we must increase our pastoral footprint. As missionary disciples, we must make great steps in advancing the new evangelization in our locality. We currently have about 2,300 registered families and only about 1,000 worshipers each week. Our newly established Office of Evangelization and Discipleship is charged to address this need. However, our present financial resources cannot sustain this gospel initiative. More funds need to be raised.
- (2) As a "brick and mortar" parish, we have eleven structures on three worship sites. Every homeowner can appreciate the need to set aside financial resources for routine and inevitably major maintenance. It would not take much for us to flounder, therefore, we need to raise funds and set them aside to care for all of our building facilities and equipment.

## OUR SHARED VISION: To flourish, to flounder, or to just get by?

Every parish, like every family, needs to ask tough questions at times. In the Diocese of Camden, all three parish situations exist. A fortunate few parishes flourish now and have made provisions for the next generation. A significant number of parishes flounder with deep debt, deteriorating assets and declining numbers. Some parishes just get by—kind of like families living from paycheck to paycheck—where one emergency could be catastrophic.

An honest assessment of Christ the Redeemer Parish is that we just get by. We all are painfully aware of the hurt caused when parishes are forced to close. **Just getting by is not sustainable.** 

Our shared vision is to rest assured that we have both the spiritual and material resources to flourish as a parish family for the foreseeable future. To realize our shared vision, we need to become **CATHOLIC STRONG!** 

As our current parishioners, we now call upon you to carry on the generosity, spirit, and sacrifice that filled the hearts of the men and women who have supported our parish and diocese throughout our history.

As we have been blessed, let us act as stewards by supporting the Catholic Strong campaign to preserve the essence of what we and all of the faithful within the greater Church in South Jersey are blessed to have and to ensure the Church's presence in the lives of our children and grandchildren. Let us continue to show the power which blessed the first apostles to our parish and diocese. Your prayers, generosity, and sacrifice will ensure our success.
