

Gospel – Luke 3: 10-18

The crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" He said to them in reply, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages."

Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.



The Angels of Advent



The Scriptures speak of angelic appearance in a matter-of-fact way. The authors of the Bible assume that angels exist and don't mind telling stories of their interactions with people on earth. Angels are God's messengers. There are four particular angels that can inspire and enlighten us during Advent.

St. Michael the Archangel – He is the princely patron and advocate angel of the people of Israel. Because of his role as protector of God's people, he is seen as a great warrior against Satan, and at the point of death, ancient Church teaching says, Michael meets the departing soul and is his advocate before Christ the great judge.

Zechariah – Is the father of John the Baptist. Zechariah doubted the truth the angel brought him about he and his wife would soon have a son. But the angel's word strengthened his faith. He went on to believe fully and utterly the magnificent words of the Benedictus which look forward to Christ's coming.

St. Joseph – Was betrothed to Mary when it was discovered that she was pregnant. In a dream an angel appeared to him and told him not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife. St. Joseph responded immediately with courage and fortitude.

Gabriel – Appears to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Blessed Virgin Mary realizes she is part of a spiritual battle. She hears the words of the angel – "Do not be afraid" and "With God all things are possible." Her response is one of instant obedience, which requires faith and courage.




