## Adoration

# What to Do in Adoration?

1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Whether you are praising, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness or seeking an answer, you'll find an appropriate psalm. The ancient prayer of the Church, called the Liturgy of the Hours, presents an excellent way to pray through the book of Psalms throughout the year.

2. Recite the "Jesus Prayer." Say "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner," repeatedly as you quiet your heart and mind.


# February is Cathedral Kitchen Collection Month!

# What is the Catholic Charismatic Renewal? The History behind the charismatic renewal, dates back to the early 20th century.

Blessed Elena Guerra of Italy wrote to Pope Leo XIII asking that he consecrate the 1900's to the Holy Spirit - which he did. During that century, a "bursting forth of the Holy Spirit" began across that nation, inspiring a new movement within the Church. In the United States, Duquesne University of the Holy Spirit in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania became the epicenter of the Catholic charismatic renewal in the late 1960's. In 1975, St. Pope Paul VI officially recognized charismatics as an important of the Church. Charismatics provide Healing to those in need of the Holy Spirit to strengthen them. They encourage that Catholics should have a personal relationship with Jesus which leads to deep and emotional experiences and expressing the "Gifts of the Spirit". This is considered as a "current of grace". Studies show that healings were part of the early Church and necessary for Evangelization. Holy Spirit Healing Prayer Services are being held across the United States. Here is what Tony Moore from a parish in Fort Wayne said after attending one service, "to me, the experience was awesome and joyful. You don't do anything; it is all Christ. It is all Him working through us, the Holy Spirit working through us".

The Good News is that on **Saturday, March 12th, 2022** in Assumption Church, Dr. Pat Vassalluzzo, assisted by Father Joseph Wallace will provide a Holy Spirit Healing Prayer Service at 11:00am. Dr. Pat, a retired physician, and his wife Kathy moved to Waterford 10 years ago. More information and details of his interest in establishing a healing and prayer group in the parish will be available in the Church Bulletin as we get closer to the date. We invite you to join us to spend time with our Lord's intercession through the Holy Spirit. Please save the date and attend. *Thank You!*
