



Bereavement Ministry





Message from Deacon Joe Janocha

Dear Parishioner,

Last weekend we returned to the Liturgical Season of Ordinary Time. Despite its title, I would argue that there is nothing "ordinary" about it. For one thing, the term in this context is not plain or common. Rather, it simply refers to the fact that the weeks are counted or "ordered." On another level, and more importantly, there is nothing that is ordinary about our liturgical celebration. At every Mass, we commemorate the sacrifice of Christ at Calvary and receive His precious gift to us of His Body and Blood. The color of the vestments we wear in that celebration does not add or take away from that wonderful reality.

As we begin the three-year Eucharistic Revival, let us strive to never lose site of that. In fact, I would challenge us all to strengthen our understanding and appreciation of Christ in the Eucharist. Let that bring us to a deeper relationship with Him and strengthen our love for Him.

This year the relationship between our Liturgical Calendar and the seasonal calendar places the return to Ordinary Time almost coinciding with the beginning of summer. While I am not sure that this is as much the case in today's fast-paced society, summer is usually seen as a season for slowing down a bit. It is a time for vacations and a lot of extra curricular activities. In our Liturgical year, we move on from the intense celebration of the Easter Season to the ensuing solemnities of Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi, to a liturgy in which our prayers and readings are focused on the teachings of Jesus in his public life and the saving nature of His earthly mission.

As we continue in Ordinary Time, our Sunday Gospel readings come from Luke.

If you are blessed with a slower pace of life in the summer, I would invite you to reflect on the readings before Mass that week. (Of course, this also applies to those who are not blessed, as this is a great habit to get into!) For the over achievers, consider reflecting on the Gospel readings for the remainder of the year as a continuum. This broader review can provide different insights into the Gospel message. Sorry if this sounds like a summer reading assignment, but there is fruit to be found.

Please accept my hope for you all to have a safe, happy, and relaxing summer - and an extraordinary return to Ordinary Time.
