40 Hours Devotion and Corpus Christi Celebration

Our annual 40 Hours Devotion will take place on Wednesday, May 29th through Saturday, June 1st, culminating in a Mass and Procession for the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) on Sunday, June 2nd. A luncheon in the parish hall will follow the Procession.

On Thursday evening, May 30th, all are invited to a special **Taizé Prayer Service** at 6:30pm in Assumption Church. Taizé Prayer is a distinctive style of meditative prayer developed by an ecumenical community of monks in rural France. It incorporates periods of silence with meditative readings from the Bible, prayers of praise and intercession, and simple, contemporary chants based on Scripture. It is a time to "come away and rest for a while" through experience of the depth of the Word of God.

40 Hours is a great time of grace for our parish and for each person who enters into this time of adoration! We approach the Lord to praise and adore Him, to thank Him and to find reassurance and peace. Because we can never leave Our Lord alone in the Blessed Sacrament, we invite you to **consider committing to one hour of adoration during these 40 hours**.
