



Also, it is not permitted to plant bushes or trees at a grave site in the cemetery. Bushes and trees encroach on neighboring plots and can impact the vault. If you have planted a bush or tree, we encourage you to remove it before the next cleanup date which is scheduled for October 31st. Our maintenance team will remove all non-conforming items during the cleanup.


Cemetery Plot Donation

A Letter from our Pastor

Dear Parishioner,

I write this letter In light of Bishop Sullivan's recent decree on August 8th, "Decree Regarding Parish Mass Schedules in the Diocese of Camden," and his letter to priests throughout the Diocese with the injunction, "Pastors are to implement the norms contained in the attached decree... It is imperative, therefore, that pastors begin to address the prescribed reduction to the parish Mass schedules immediately." In essence the Bishop spoke of the priest shortage as something no longer viewed as a future happening but as a new reality for our Diocese. He also mentioned in his letter that our retired priests, who help out in many of our parishes, including our own, are aging rapidly and being stretched too thin, as they are being asked to help out in so many parishes. He explained, "We are currently blessed to have healthy retired priests who are faithful in assisting parishes with Sunday Masses. However, their numbers are dwindling as is the overall number of priests serving in our Diocese of Camden. All of our priests continue to advance in years. Prayers for vocations and in active ministry in every parish to raise up vocations are absolutely necessary, but it takes nearly a decade for a vocation to lead to ordination. As such, we will have an unavoidable gap that requires a reduction in parish Mass schedules."

To this end, I called for an unscheduled meeting of the Parish Pastoral Council, as well as, the staff and Finance Council, this past Wednesday, to review our present Mass schedule and forge a plan to implement the new mandate for parishes with one priest assigned (which will encompass all parishes in the next few years) to bring our schedule of Masses in line with the Bishop's decree. We thought it best to address this issue immediately as we had to make a decision about what our winter and summer Mass schedules would be at this time, anyway. That would mean that we would be going from our normal schedule of 5 Masses on the weekend to the prescribed 3 Masses in a parish with only one priest assigned. As I shared at the end of Mass at both St. Anthony's and Sacred Heart churches this past weekend, that I would be meeting with the councils and staff to discuss this important change from the Diocese. I also hinted at what I thought would most likely be the outcome of these deliberations that Sunday Masses at our Sacred Heart church would probably end. To my surprise when the actual deliberations took place on Wednesday evening the discussion went in quite a different direction. It was brought up by several people present for the meeting, after they had an opportunity to hear the average Mass attendance numbers at our three churches over the past year (and since the end of the Covid restrictions), that the average overall attendance at our parish on weekends hovers around 550 attendees. After much discussion, the proposal to be voted upon was where and when would these three Masses take place. The Councils voted in the affirmative that all three weekend Masses would be celebrated in the Assumption church for our parish of Christ the Redeemer. The new year-round Mass schedule, which begins the first weekend in October at our parish of Christ the Redeemer will be as follows, Saturdays 4:00pm, Sunday mornings at 9:00am and 11:00am, all at Assumption church. This was based primarily on seating space for these three Masses, as Assumption church can seat somewhere around 600 people. It was also decided that both St. Anthony and Sacred Heart churches will continued be used for funerals, baptisms, and weddings, but no weekend Masses.

I know this will be disappointing to those who regularly worship at our two smaller churches! But I have come to learn in the past year as your pastor that this is a strong, vibrant community, who I pray will step up to the present situation and preserve our unity as parish.

Bereavement Ministry


